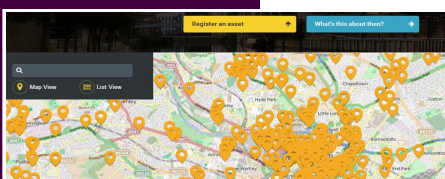

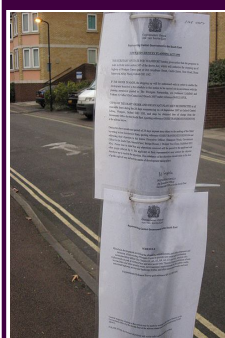
LEEDS ASSET MAP

STATUTORY NOTICES



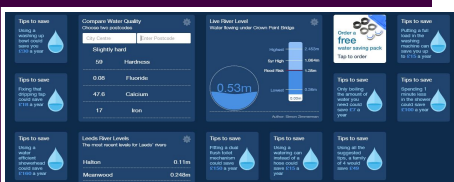
Leeds City Council and Hebe Works are jointly working on a pilot project to provide a new way to access public notice information. Traditionally, this has been done either by notices on lampposts or in the print media.

Using the new City Dashboard (due to launch in September), members of the public will be able to view all notices and even narrow the search to those closest to them.

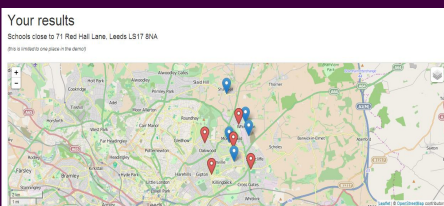
YORKSHIRE WATER DATA DIVE
